



Together, Propositions J and K guarantee funding for two of San Francisco's most pressing issues: **homelessness and transportation.**

Prop J goes along with Prop K and guarantees that every penny of the money will be spent on the City's most important priorities - addressing our homeless crisis and fixing roads and transit.

**Prop K secures the funding. Prop J invests in our priorities.
We can't have J without K.**

Props J and K will:

- **increase BART and Muni reliability** to make moving around San Francisco easier and less crowded.
- **keep fares low** for low-income families, youth, seniors and people with disabilities.
- **make it safer for people to get around** the City by funding improvements such as better bike lanes, wider sidewalks and traffic signals.
- **reduce wear and tear on buses and cars** by increasing street repaving and pothole repair.

- **keep homeless children and families together** by providing a guaranteed place to stay, rather than having to move around to find shelter on the streets.
- **deliver supportive services to address mental health and substance abuse** for approximately 1,000 homeless people per year.
- **Help fund the Navigation Center system**, which will assist 2,400 people per year.
- **assist over 1,500 people permanently exit homelessness.**

Prop K would increase our sales tax from 8.75% to 9.25% to fund the programs above. It is **progressive and fair** because local residents only pay about half the sales tax, while the rest is paid for by visitors, tourists and businesses. **The sales tax does not cover groceries, rent, utilities or many other day to day expenses.** Furthermore, the services funded by K would benefit low-income residents.

Props J and K ensure that **one-hundred percent of the money will remain local** to address our homelessness and transportation challenges. San Francisco will still have a **lower sales tax rate (9.25%)** than many other Bay Area cities and counties.

Remember, we need both J & K!
